a look at the musicians

AS BOTH A SOLOIST and a principal trumpeter and cornetist, Pamela Smitter has captivated audiences around the world with her powerful yet soulful artistry. Performing with profound expression and a rare blend of compelling and nuanced musical styles, she is highly regarded for her musical orchestral leadership and teaching skills.

For almost three decades, Dr. Smitter served as the principal trumpet with the West Michigan Symphony Orchestra and a member of the Kalamazoo Symphony Orchestra. In addition to her role as principal solo cornet with the ORCHID CITY BRASS BAND, she also currently performs with the Miami Symphony Orchestra.

Pamela has performed internationally in the *HornPipes! Duo* and released an album, HARK!, with this ensemble in 2010. Previously, she was the principal trumpet *solista* in the Orquesta Sinfónica de Maracaibo, and subsequently, with the Orquesta Sinfónica de Venezuela and the Sinfonietta de Caracas.

Dr. Smitter completed her Doctor of Musical Arts degree at Michigan State University in December, 2020. She received her Master of Music degree in Trumpet Performance from the University of Michigan studying under Armando Ghitalla. As Adjunct Professor of Music, she served on Purdue University-Fort Wayne's brass faculty and held similar positions at Grand Valley State University, Hope College, and Alma College (in Michigan). She served as Lead Musician for the *Carnegie Hall LinkUP!* orchestra educational program from 2004-2012, coaching more than 100 participating teachers and colleagues as *musician-mentor*.

Dr. Smitter has performed with the Gaudete Brass Quintet, performed and conducted the Michigan State University Graduate Brass Quintet, and been a frequent soloist at the annual White Lake Chamber Music Festival. She has served as adjudicator for the Sphinx Orchestral Partners Association (SOPA) Excerpt Competition and the National Youth Orchestra of the United States of America (NYO-USA).

Dr. Smitter greets every opportunity with exceptional purpose, extraordinary spirit, and a zest for unparalleled success.

BAND. I am pleased and honored to be on stage with the talented and dedicated members of this musical ensemble.

During the years of my youth I had many opportunities to learn about music, and to learn about life and the importance of learning valuable lessons which would serve me well later in life. One such opportunity was serving in the United States Air Force during the Vietnam Conflict. My personal convictions were forged by the many lessons learned while serving our country during that difficult era.

Therefore, to me, this Veteran's Day concert represents an occasion to revisit and reinforce the importance of our country's most fundamental values and the supreme importance of our democracy.

It is our hope that you will celebrate those values and find a special place of remembrance for those that gave their all for our continuing freedom. The members of the ORCHID CITY BRASS BAND offer you our version of that celebration and remembrance with our musical contributions this evening.

While all of the selections for this evening's concert will provide unique musical insight into American patriotism, I believe there is special significance to the music of Aaron Copland's composition: Lincoln Portrait. The narration used in this masterpiece of orchestration with human voice are taken directly from the speeches and correspondence of one American who served with honor during a time of national difficulty: Our 16th president. The words you will hear tonight include the following:

That from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they gave the last full measure of devotion: That we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain....

We are eager to bring our 2022 version of this Patriotic Concert to you this evening and to share with you the unique reality – and privilege – of being an American!
