WELCOME to the ORCHID CITY BRASS BAND's 10th anniversary concert hosted by **Frank Cerabino** and featuring showbiz & music industry legend **Tom "Bones" Malone**.

Attempting to catalogue Mr. Malone's accomplishments is an exercise in futility – although his website www.tombonesmalone.net has an expansive list that's worth your time – and includes his 4000+ shows with The World's Most Dangerous Band (Late Night with David Letterman).

In keeping with Mr. Malone's history, the band is performing iconic music of an era that witnessed significant social change, including the transformation of formulaic popular music into something artistic, emotive, powerful—and groovy!

What you'll hear are not mere covers of recordings but special arrangements elevating the music to a different level. One example: the Beatles' "Ticket to Ride" – ostensibly about a liberated young women setting out on a train to pursue her own path in life – is augmented by the band creating the sound of a steam engine as our heroine departs one station and arrives at another.

Directing tonight's program is Ms. **Jennifer Girdlestone**. Her work as Director of Bands at Boca Raton High School is highly regarded in the regional education community, as

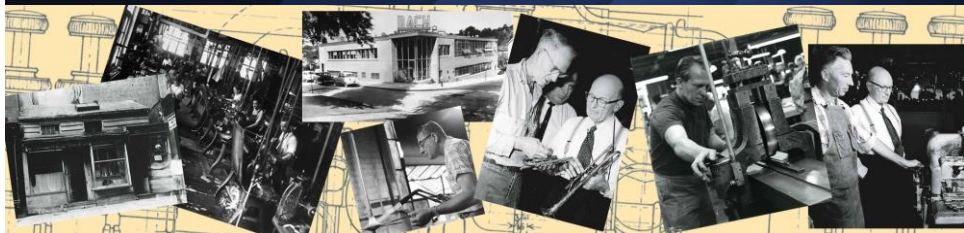

guest artist spotlight

DESPITE HIS NICKNAME Tom “Bones” Malone, began his professional career playing lead trumpet with Brenda Lee in Jackson, MS while enrolled at the University of Southern Mississippi. Malone continued working as a performer after transferring to North Texas State University.

Upon graduation, Malone played with the bands of Woody Herman, Frank Zappa, Spyro Gyra, Doc Severinsen and Blood, Sweat & Tears. In 1973, Malone began a 15-year association with Gil Evans, with whom Malone recorded seven albums and toured Europe, Japan & the Far East.

A call in the early 1970s from Saturday Night Live (SNL) led to Malone performing & arranging for the show from 1975-1985. In 1981 became the musical director of the SNL Band.

A single SNL comedy skit featuring John Belushi & Dan Aykroyd turned into “The Blues Brothers,” for which Malone wrote the first chart then continued as an integral member of the franchise. Malone’s work is on all Blues Brothers recordings and The Blues Brothers (Universal) film score. In 1997 Blues Brothers 2000 was released with considerable contributions to the film score by Malone.

In 1993, Malone reunited with SNL veterans Paul Schaffer & Will Lee to form the house band for The Late Show with David Letterman, with whom he worked until the final episode in 2015.

An active writer & performer, Malone can be heard on the recordings of a Who’s Who list of jazz, R&B, rock & classical artists. His credits include performances with James Brown, Ray Charles, Miles Davis, Pink Floyd, Diana Ross, Paul Simon, Bruce Springsteen & Diana Ross.

Besides performing, arranging, producing & composing, Malone is an active clinician in educational settings. He currently lives in Manhattan.

**JENN GIRDLESTONE****OCBB GUEST CONDUCTOR**

JENN GIRDLESTONE is in her 13th year as the director of bands at Boca Raton Community High School where she oversees the concert bands, marching band, and jazz band. Her Symphonic band consistently performs at a Superior level and her marching band has placed in the top 10 in the state of Florida for the past 10+ years.

Jenn attended Florida State University where she graduated magna cum laude with a Bachelor of Music Education and a Bachelor of Music in Horn Performance. While at FSU she performed in the world-renowned

Florida State University Marching Chiefs, serving as Head Drum Major and Horn Section Leader. She also performed in the Symphonic Band, Wind Orchestra, Philharmonia, and Symphony Orchestra. During her college years, she performed as a member of the Boston Crusaders Drum and Bugle Corps for four years, serving the last two years as Mellophone Section Leader and Soloist. She was also a member of the Tau Beta Sigma national honorary band service sorority.

Jenn has a passion for developing student leadership and training the next generation of leaders. She directs the Marching Band Leadership camp for Palm Beach County's Summer Band Camps and co-leads the Drum Major session at Penny's Camp in St. Petersburg, FL. Jenn is also a clinical educator and works with college interns as they make final preparations to become music teachers in their own classrooms.

This is Jenn's 11th year performing with the ORCHID CITY BRASS and is the principal solo tenor horn. "I am excited for the opportunity to conduct this ensemble and humbled to be standing in front of so many talented musicians. Thank you ORCHID CITY for honoring me with this opportunity on this occasion. And thank YOU, our audience for taking time to attend our concert and celebrate with us!"

introducing our host

FRANK CERABINO (pronounced chair-a-BEE-no) grew up on Long Island, New York, and graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy at Annapolis, Maryland, in 1977. He spent five years in the Navy, reaching the rank of lieutenant and serving as a public affairs officer aboard an aircraft carrier. After leaving the Navy, he received a master's degree in journalism at Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois.

Cerabino worked at the City News Bureau of Chicago before leaving the wire service to take a job with the Miami Herald in 1984. For the next five years Cerabino covered the police, government, legal and education beats for the Herald. He eventually became the newspaper's federal court reporter in Miami, Florida.

Cerabino joined the Palm Beach Post in 1989. He started writing columns for the newspaper during the William Kennedy Smith trial. In 1992 he became a full-time local news columnist and now writes four columns a week.

Cerabino is known for his humorous and satirical observations on local and national news. With a focus on Florida and West Palm Beach, Cerabino's articles often touch on political issues, social commentary, and cultural observations. His work has won him numerous journalism awards and spawned five books that take a lighthearted look at the eccentricities of life in the Sunshine State. His writing has also been featured in various publications, including Yahoo News and the Orlando Sentinel.

In 2018, Cerabino won a national Sigma Delta Chi award from the Society of Professional Journalists for column writing. He lives in Boca Raton with his wife and has three children.
